Each candidate statement needs to be sent in unformatted text within the body of an email (no attachments, no bold, no underline, use dashes and the space bar instead of automatic bullet points, etc.). Formatted text leads to conversion problems between different operating systems, MAC/PC problems, unrecognizable characters, etc. Also, this information will not be edited for spelling/grammatical errors.

- March 10 (Wednesday)
 - Election brochure with candidate information gets published to the AS website on this date.
- March 12 (Friday)
 - Balloting begins. An email with exact instructions for voting will be sent to all voting members.
- March 18 (Thursday)
 - Voting period ends at noon. More details about how to get ballots to us and the time/place ballots will be counted will be provided on voting instructions.
