
**OEI Goals:** Significantly increase CCC student transfer to 4-year institutions; Increase student completion by system collaboration in providing access to quality online courses and support services for students; create economies of scale in resource and technology acquisition (\$8,000,000 yearly savings on CMS infrastructure alone).

  - Canvas by Instructure was selected in February 2015 as the common course management system for the CCC's.
  - As of Feb. 1, over 57 colleges have committed to adopting a state wide course management infrastructure-Canvas.
- Counseling for Online Students
  - o Cranium Café counseling platform chosen in 12/2015
  - Online Counselors Community of Practice will start in early 2016




## **OEI Course Exchange Component:**

- Will allow students needing courses that are not available at their home college, to seamlessly enroll in those courses, as needed, at other CCCs, thereby, leveling the enrollments in high demand or difficultto-fill courses. (available for initial pilots in Fall 2016, expand in Fall 2017)
- Will include access to resources for both colleges and students
- Will improve completion rates across the state by providing access to more courses.
- Student Information System Adapter will be available in March of 2016: Connect state wide enrollment systems.

#### The Numbers as of 2/29/16:

- 24 initial pilot colleges were chosen from 58 applicants to serve in three groups of 8 in July of 2014
- 11,573 students have been given access to tutoring and online learning readiness support in the pilots (297 sections) and many more via open system use.
- 90 courses have completed 1st level review for the pilot group.
- Over 300 faculty members across the state have been trained to align the course design rubric (more every semester).
- Approximately 20 courses will pilot the course exchange mechanism (cross-college enrollment) in Fall of 2016
- Over 70 of the 113 colleges have participated in some way with OEI Activities
- Over 57 colleges have committed to adopting the Canvas CMS infrastructure.



#### Benefits to the System:

- Established shared mechanism for student crossregistration in online courses and programs
- Savings of over \$10,000,000 by purchasing of infrastructure systems and resources at scale.
- Shared effective practices for teaching, learning, counseling, student services and business practices
- Updating of regulations to meet the needs of a digital-age.
- System-wide Colleges prepared to meet the Distance Education Program compliance requirements of ACCJC and Federal ADA.
- Ability to address any impending "free college" initiative.
- Improved economic impact of an educated population

- Consistently high quality online learning environment
- Support resources that include just-in-time resources and online readiness resources.
- Increased and timely access to high demand courses to aid in completion of educational goals
- Increased number and availability of degree programs
